Background : It is now abundantly clear that success in achieving the goals on sanitation coverage would require continued government priority to this national goal, stimulating the community motivation, innovative technology and business models, sustained handholding of entrepreneurs, active involvement of local government units, imaginative institution mechanisms, creative capacity building and last but not the least appreciation and celebration of success stories.

Poo 2 Loo Campaign : UNICEF has launched a campaign “Take Poo to Loo” to create awareness about Open Defecation amongst youth and young adults. As part of this campaign, IIT Delhi is partnering UNICEF to conduct several outreach activities among students and youth such as cycle rallies, cultural events, film making competitions to depict best cases and success stories and challenges, poster design contest, mobile apps design contest. The Delhi campaign will culminate in the Sanitation Roundtable on 6th March 2014 to examine successes that have been achieved recently and to look at challenges in ensuring safe and sustainable sanitation for all.

Roundtable Objectives : To bring together students and youth, representatives and stakeholders from government, multilateral agencies, grassroot organizations, funding agencies, technology institutions, manufacturers and entrepreneurs, corporate bodies and citizen groups to deliberate on how to collaborate and co-create solutions, systems and supply-chains to augment and sustain success achieved as also to accelerate and stimulate areas and domains which have been a cause of concern.
